
In this family garden Cavanaugh encourages us to plant sixteen rows:

- 4 rows of Let us: Let us be faithful in word and deed, let us be unselfish, let us be loyal and let us love one another.
- 3 rows of Squash: Squash gossip, squash criticism and squash indifference,

and finally 5 rows of Turn up: Turn up to school and sporting events, turn up to family gatherings, turn up with a better attitude, turn up with new ideas and the determination to carry them out, and turn up with a smile.

If you plant and nurture these 'value seeds' in your family garden and here at school we are bound to have a productive year and a bountiful harvest.

SPORT AND NEWS

TERM 1

This term is a very busy term for sport. Round 6 of the summer season continues this Thursday 4th February against Ashfield. With only two rounds remaining, every team is nicely placed to qualify for a semi final berth in three weeks time. A reminder to all representative boys of our expectations in regards to uniform and the way in which we compete against other schools. We not only pride ourselves on our results but also the way in which we compete and present ourselves. Boys will not be permitted to compete unless they have the correct uniform. The Cross Country championships will also be held on Thursday for the remainder of boys in Years 7 to 10. The Under 12's, 13's & 14's will compete at Coral Sea Park, South Maroubra while the Under 15's & 16's will run at Latham Park, South Coogee. Buses will transport boys to and from each venue and boys will be permitted to leave from the venue. In the following weeks, Year 7 to 10 will revert to internal sport. Every boy will be required to bring their house coloured shirt for sport each week. The Year 11 and 12 boys begin their free choice sports this Thursday at various venues.

SWIMMING CARNIVAL

The 87th Marcellin College Annual Swimming carnival will take place on Friday 5th February at the Des Renford Aquatic Centre, Heffron Park. Events will commence at 9.00 am and should be completed by 2.00 pm. Every boy must come dressed in colours to represent their house. The best dressed and best represented house will earn points towards the Spirit Cup. Ignatius have won 5 of the last 6 titles but judging from past carnivals, Champagnat will be fighting right down to the last race. The Marcellin staff have held the Staff v Student title for over 10 years now, so this should make for an interesting race at the end of the day. I'd advise each boy to bring a packed lunch and their own drink bottles as each year group will have limited time to use the canteen. As is the case with every outdoor activity, we encourage each boy to bring their own sunscreen and apply it regularly throughout the day, and also have a hat on when not competing. We ask that any boy competing in a championship event must have either correct swimming costume or the aqua skins. A letter has been given to every boy in homeroom this week with additional information. Parents are most welcome to attend in what is always a highlight in our sporting calender. After both the Swimming and Cross Country carnivals, teams will be selected to compete at the Metropolitan Catholic Colleges carnivals. The Swimming carnival will take place at Homebush Aquatic Centre on Thursday 4th March. Competition begins at 3pm and it is compulsory for all Year 7 and 12 boys to attend. The Cross Country carnival will take place on Thursday 18th March. I will give more details as we get closer to these events.

At the end of last year our Surfing championships were held at Maroubra Beach. Under some very good surfing conditions, Jake Scott was judged Year 9 and Overall Champion with Hank Hartley and Jackson Giles winning the Year 8 and Year 7 divisions respectively. Well done to these boys and all boys who competed on the day.
